RESOLUTION 10.14.24 B

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF GRAINGER COUNTY, TENNESSEE, RECOGNIZING OCTOBER 14, 2024, AS A DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR WILLIAM LAWRENCE "BIII" GAULTNEY

WHEREAS, William Lawrence Gaultney was born July 6, 1925 in Giles County Tennessee, a resident of Grainger County since 1966, passed away on January 25, 2018; and

WHEREAS, William (Bill) attended Elkton High School and ready to launch into life, he volunteered to join the US Navy on his 18th birthday during World War II. He proudly served on a ship in the Pacific Theater until the war ended and finished his military career four years later in the Naval reserves and he also became a member of American Legion; and

WHEREAS, Bill attended the University of Tennessee where he met his lovely wife Maria Doka from Morristown, Tennessee and they were married August 28, 1949, five months after he graduated with a degree in Agricultural Engineering; and

WHEREAS, Bill left the hills of East Tennessee and moved to Indiana where he managed a large crop and livestock farm associated with the famous French Lick Springs Hotel. He later moved back to East Tennessee in 1955 where he became the farm manager for Holston Methodist Children's Home. In addition to his farming activities, he trained and mentored young men, many of whom were orphans, to grow into hard working, trustworthy and competent contributors to society. His efforts in mentoring and training are recognized by graduates from those classes whereby funding for scholarships were established at Holston Home in the names of Bill and Maria Gaultney; and

WHEREAS, Bill began another phase of his life with his wife and family that was termed an adventure, leaving the hills of East Tennessee once again and traveling half way across the world to one of the poorest countries in the world, East Pakistan, where he and Maria served as missionaries. Their mission house in Naogaon had no running water or electricity. While living there for almost four years, Bill helped start a school and taught agricultural principles and new farming techniques to young farmers from the villages while his wife taught sewing and cooking to the ladies from the local village; and

WHEREAS, after an epic journey across Europe, Bill and his family returned to East Tennessee in 1963 living in Morristown and Rogersville. In 1966 Bill became County Supervisor for the USDA Farmer's Home Administration in Grainger and Union Counties where he found his family home after 25 years of travel; and

WHEREAS, Bill was active with the Boys Scouts of America and his community. He started a Little League baseball team for the young men of Poor Valley, Kingswood School and the Rock Haven areas where the team went from last place to county champions in a few short years. He joined his neighbors and friends in assisting with the start-up of the Ecumenical Easter Sunrise Service at the top of Clinch Mountain. In 1976 Bill assisted other committee members in selecting Grainger County's Bicentennial Flag and Tree, which was approved by the Grainger County Legislative Body and celebrated with a ceremony on February 24, 1976. Bill's most meaningful experiences of life continued over a 30-year period where he made weekly visits to the Grainger County Jail providing encouragement where he shared Christ's love with short Bible studies, a few songs and prayers that touched many people; and

WHEREAS, Bill was honored for his contributions to society with several acknowledgements such as 1969 and 1970 Tanasi Girl Scout Council Campaign; 1989 USDA Award for Superior Service; 1991 Grainger County Chamber Person of the Year; 1998 Service to the Adult Literacy Program; 2006 Imprint Award from Camp Wesley Woods; 2008 Selfless Acts of time and dedication to Grainger County Adult Education; 2008 Volunteer of the Year of the Tennessee Association for Adult and Community Education; 2010 Foundation for Evangelism Harry Denman Evangelism Award; and a plaque presented by the Grainger County Thanksgiving Service for many years of Faithful Christian Service; and

WHEREAS, William Lawrence Gaultney passed peacefully without pain from his earthly life to his eternal life on January 25, 2018 at his home in Bean Station, Tennessee.

RESOLVED, BY THE GRAINGER COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY, that in order to Recognize, Honor and Remember the aforementioned accomplishments of William Lawrence "Bill" Gaultney, October 14, 2024 shall be remembered as "WILLIAM LAWRENCE "BIll" GAULTNEY REMEMBRANCE DAY".

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be presented to Maria Doka Gaultney (wife of 68 years) and his family as further evidence of the sincere admiration and gratitude of this legislative body;

The Grainger County Parks and Recreation Department would like to provide you with a department report covering through OCTOBER 3, 2024.

Three-Star Grant Award

TVA approved the required permit to move forward with stage construction at Grainger County Park. Work has begun and should be completed and ready to use for the concert series at the Fall Festival.

Food Truck Friday Events

We partnered this year with the Grainger County Chamber of Commerce for the 2nd Annual Food Truck Friday Event at Grainger County Park. The first event this season was held on Friday, April 26, 2024 and was a huge success even with bad weather. The Food Truck Friday event for Friday September 27, 2024 had to be canceled because of bad weather. We have scheduled one more event for Friday October 25th, 2024. This one will be the last of this year. These monthly events brought a lot of people into our park and was a huge success.

Grainger County Fall Festival

This year's 4th Annual Fall Festival was held on October 4th and 5th. Grainger's Got Talent and the Covid Memorial was held on Friday October 4th this year in conjunction with the Fall Festival. At the time of this report we have 29 Arts and Crafts vendors and 7 Food Truck Vendors committed to be here.

Lighting at Grainger County Park

AEC installed new poles and lights at Grainger County Park for increased security last month. As stated at last month's County Commissioners meeting there was a need for more lighting down closer to the boat ramp. We picked a spot closer to the top of the boat ramp and it was approved for one pole and light system. Cost of the new pole installation will be \$238.00 and an additional \$ 16.75 per month added to our AEC bill. By the time of this meeting the pole and light should be in place.

Youth Basketball Program

We are currently making plans for our youth basketball program with signups having already begun on Monday September 30th, 2024. We had approximately 380 kids registered in this program last year and we are looking at this number or more this year. Sign ups will end at noon on Friday November 8th, 2024.

A RESOLUTION – 10.14.24A - to increase the minimum monthly service retirement allowance for former, current and future members of boards, commissions, committees, councils and the like with creditable service in the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-35-226.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-36-209(a)(2) provides that the chief legislative body of any city, special school district or county may increase the minimum service retirement allowance payable to its former, current and future members of boards, commissions, committees, councils and the like with respect to creditable service established by such members pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-35-226. Said minimum service retirement allowance may be increased as follows:

- (i) Eighteen dollars and fifty-five cents (\$18.55) per month effective as of July 1, 2024 for each year of such creditable service, but adjusted on each July 1 thereafter pursuant to the cost-of-living provisions in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-36-701(b)(1) and (2); or
- (ii) Twenty-Six dollars and fifty cents (\$26.50) per month effective as of July 1, 2024 for each year of such creditable service, but adjusted on each July 1 thereafter pursuant to the cost-of-living provisions in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-36-701(b)(1) and (2); and

WHEREAS, to set the minimum service retirement allowance under either item (i) or item (ii) above, the chief legislative body of the respective city, special school district or county must pass a resolution authorizing the provisions of either item (i) or item (ii) above and paying the estimated increased pension liability (x) in a lump sum or (y) through an increase in the employer contribution rate of the city, special school district or county for the next fiscal year (July 1 - June 30) following the adoption of the resolution or (z) through amortizing the amount over a period of time not to exceed ten (10) years from the date of the adoption of the resolution.

WHEREAS, any such resolution must apply to current and future retirees and must become effective on the first day of any quarter following the filing of the resolution with the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System; provided that if the amount is to be paid in a lump sum or through an increase in the employer contribution rate for the next July 1 – June 30 as provided above, the first day of the quarter must be after the estimated increased pension liability has been totally funded by the respective city, special school district or county). No retroactive benefits shall be paid under the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-36-209(a)(2).

Details for each award are:

Access Fund – Enhance recreational trails in the Foster Falls Recreation Area. This project includes trail building, developing climbing areas, restoring existing access paths, creation of staging areas to include stone retaining walls and stairs, and creation of a "passing trail."

<u>Requirements for Use:</u> Hamblen County Residents, Churches and Non-Profit Organizations will be permitted to bring <u>3-</u>ton of MSW waste per calendar year without charge. Proof of residency is required before being allowed to dump, such as driver's license, utility bill etc.

All Apartments, Duplexes, Rental Property and Trailer Parks are considered commercial property and customers will be required to pay \$50.00 a ton for the load.

Tires: \$165 per ton with no exceptions

Jefferson County

C&D Construction and Demolition Material: \$35.00 per ton

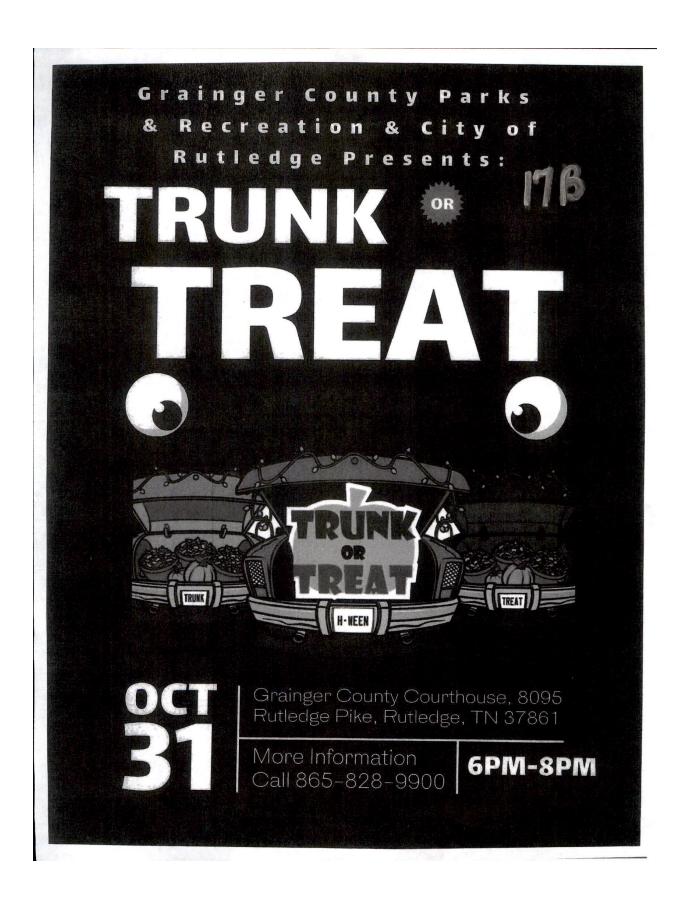
